Most second cutting Alfalfa is done in the southern part of the state and some have even taken an early second cutting of some grass and clover hay as well. As predicted many producers are running out of places to put hay, and buyers for beef cattle hay are generally still not showing a lot of interest to get hay early. Many areas quite possibility had harvest cut short last night. Some areas In central and north of I-70 received strong winds and heavy rain, which can be disaster to a crop that becomes as sensitive as fescue right before harvest. Total extent of damage will not be known for a couple of days. This could not have come at a worse time as conditions were just becoming right, moisture content in the southwest was being measured in the high teens from standing crop. The southwest part of the state had been harvesting since right after last weeks report with more trucks arriving each day. Central and southeast had also begun. Most of the northeast and northwest areas were still waiting for less moisture. Prices this week remained steady in all areas of the state.
