Scattered summer showers fell in a isolated spots this week dropping as much as an inch of rain in a few small areas. Movement is still fairly slow, as most farmers are more worried about baling hay than selling it at the moment. A few farmers are seeing straw sales pick up a little. The hay crop in MO has been exceptional so far this year the nice weather during June allowed for very good growth of hay. We have had a tremendous amount of grass hay baled this year with many farmers getting a very early second cutting. Alfalfa hay has been good as far as the amount goes but most quality has been a bit lower mostly because the weather has not allowed farmers to get it cut at the best times. Missouri Regional Fescue Seed Report

Fescue seed prices in all areas of the state are steady with last week. Seed is dry in southern Missouri. Harvest described as moderate to heavy and nearly complete. Mid-Missouri's seed moisture at 14% to 20% with supply heavy to moderate and harvest estimated to be 60-75% complete. Northern moisture levels range from 14% to 19% in the west and 19% to 24% in the east. Supply moderate to mostly light, harvest 40% to 75% complete. All areas of the state report cleaner heavier seed than last year. Quantity of the harvest was smaller than it's potential, because many of last year's seed fields became hay fields this year due to heavy orchard grass discounts, hay shortage in the Northwest, and a lower price for seed across the state. (Dry: Moisture 12-14%-Wet: Moisture greater than 14%) (Prices per lb.)Prices: .18 wet, .20 Dry

Weekly Crop Report

Missouri farmers made good progress with wheat harvesting and haying as weather was favorable over most of the state during the past week. Days suitable for fieldwork averaged 4.9, with all districts indicating at least 4 days suitable. Row crops are making good growth except where hampered by excessive moisture in low areas. The topsoil moisture supply was reported as 1 percent very short, 17 percent short, 79 percent adequate and 3 percent surplus. The west central district is the driest area, with a rating of 47 percent being short or very short. Areas with surplus moisture are mostly scattered and localized but still significant where flash flooding occurred. Twenty percent of the corn is silking, nearly the same as a year earlier but behind the 5-year average of 23 percent. Silking progress ranges from virtually none in many northern counties to 80 percent in the southeast district. Corn condition is reported as 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 22 percent fair, 56 percent good and 16 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from a week earlier. Ninety-five percent of the expected soybean acreage has been planted, slightly behind a year earlier but a few days ahead of the 5-year average of 92 percent. Planting in the southern third of the State is least advanced, varying from about 80 percent complete in the southwest and south-central districts to 89 percent in the southeast. Bean planting is virtually complete in most northern counties, with mainly some of the previously flooded fields still being planted. Eighty-six percent of the soybeans have emerged, compared with the 5-year average of 89 percent. Soybean condition is rated as 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 52 percent good and 8 percent excellent, similar to a week ago. Sorghum is 96 percent planted, nearly the same as last year and the average of 98 percent. Pasture condition ratings are reported as 5 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 54 percent good and 10 percent excellent, a minor decline from a week earlier. Condition is holding well above the ratings of the past 2 years for this date.
