MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY

Hay farming can become quite repetitive in the middle of summer. The excitement from the beginning of season seems to disappear and having isn't quite as much fun, the tractor seats seem get harder and the fields get rougher. According to this weeks state crop report here is how the state progress is currently standing. Ninety-three percent of the second crop of alfalfa hay has been cut, a few days ahead of the both last year and normal, while the third cutting is 13 percent complete, equal to normal. Ninety-eight percent of other hay is cut, over a week ahead of last year and normal. Many farmers are saying that so far they have baled a very large amount of hay from the first two cuttings, but as they are starting the third cutting yield is falling flat on it's face because of the lack of rain in many areas.
