Weather in Missouri continues to go from one extreme to the other. Hay sellers are giving about the same story. Some are barely stopping long enough to reload the trucks, while others are watching their truck tires dry rot from setting. It continues to be difficult to find higher quality hay and when one does most asking prices don't fall in the range that truckers can resell it and pay their fuel bill. Truckers are also covering more ground now looking for better quality hay. Lower quality hay continues to be very heavy in supply and moving at a slower pace. Prices on this hay remains steady, as you don't have to travel far to find a pile this year. Hay supply is moderate to heavy, demand moderate, and prices are steady with a firm undertone.
