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**2003 Missouri Show Me Select Replacement Heifer  
 Sales Summary for Spring Calving Heifers**

Seven sales took place around the state, with a total of 1,728 heifers sold, and a statewide average of \$1,122 per head. This was compared to last fall when 1,625 head sold for a statewide average of \$951 per head.

Here's how each sale sold: Joplin sold 364 head with a \$1,073 average; Kingsville sold 162 head for a \$1,127 average; Fruitland sold 215 head averaging \$1,197 per head; Sedalia sold 116 head for \$1,079 per head; Macon sold 245 heifers for an average of \$1,085; Palmyra sold 328 head with an average of \$1,136; and Mt. Grove sold 298 heifers for \$1,155 per head.

The sales are coordinated by the University of Missouri Extension, University of Missouri Commercial Agriculture Program, MU College of Veterinary Medicine, Missouri Cattlemen's Association and the Missouri Department of Agriculture. All heifers met minimum standards for reproductive soundness, pelvic size, body condition, and weight. They had also undergone a comprehensive health program and were guaranteed bred to easy calving bulls, many being artificially bred.

The majority of the heifers sold are expected to calve from February thru April 2004 with projected calving dates given for each lot of heifers. The offering was screened, graded, body condition scored (BCS) by official Missouri Department of Agriculture/USDA graders, then sorted into lots according to calving dates and body type similarity where permissible.

Four spring sales in 2004 are tentatively scheduled to sell fall calving heifers. Locations and times will be announced.
