**Missouri Crop Report**

The 2003 Missouri growing season resulted in yields well below normal in many areas for corn and soybean crops according to Gene Danekas, State Statistician. "Drought conditions hurt crops in many counties beginning in July, particularly in the northwest, north-central and west-central districts." said Danekas. "Crops in most eastern counties fared better, especially in the Bootheel where excellent yields were produced." Missouri soybean production in 2003 totaled 143 million bushels, down 16 percent from the 2002 crop and 23 percent below the 2001 production. Farmers in Missouri harvested 4.94 million of the 5.0 million acres planted in the State. Missouri yields averaged 29 bushels per acre, down 5 bushels from the 2002 yield and 4.6 bushels below the 5-year average. Corn production in Missouri during 2003 totaled 302 million bushels, 7 percent above a year earlier but 13 percent below the 2001 production. Yields for the State averaged 108 bushels per acre, up 3 bushels from 2002 but 11 bushels below the 5-year average. Out of 2.9 million planted acres, corn for grain was produced from 2.8 million acres and silage was cut on 80,000 acres. Missouri grain sorghum production totaled 16.2 million bushels, up 3 percent from 2002. Of the 215,000 acres planted, 210,000 were harvested for grain. Average yield for the State was 77 bushels per acre, down 8 bushels from the 2002 yield and 7 bushels below the 5-year average. Hay production in the State totaled a record 8.17 million tons, 4 percent above the level of the past 2 years. Missouri hay yields averaged 1.92 tons per acre, compared with 1.84 tons in 2002 and a 1.93 ton 5-year average yield.
