WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY

With a few days of good weather, farmers have been so busy most don't know if they're coming or going. Farmers are trying to bale hay, combine wheat or fescue seed, a few still trying to plant their first crop of beans, and some are trying to do everything at once. Condition of hay varies through out the state. There is some good quality hay that has been baled dry if one puts in enough time to find it. Most of the state is doing very well on the moisture side; the northwest part of the state has officially exited the drought after two years. Grass hoppers are showing up in many areas even with all the moisture, so far no reports of spraying but it wouldn't surprise me if some have. Hay prices were steady this week, demand moderate, and supply is heavy. The Missouri Department of Agriculture has a hay hotline available for both buyers and sellers. WEEKLY FESCUE REPORT

Fescue seed harvest is moving along. It has been a tough year so far. It seems just about the time the combine starts running good and farmers feel that things are going well, another two tenths of rain pops up and puts harvest back on hold. Many acres of seed are laying in windrows in the southwest region waiting for sun. Some loss has been reported now from stump seed, the southeast seems to be hardest hit so far. Prices are starting to show some variation, due in part to buyers needs and the quality of seed in the area. Moisture levels are running mostly in the high teens throughout the state on seed that has been brought to the buying stations. It may be early to tell for sure, but it's starting to look like it may be hard to make an average harvest now.
