Most of the heavy to hard rain occurred in the central and northern part of the state. Hay movement remains light, as most farmers either have full barns or are just not too worried about hay because of the large supply this year. Many sellers are unsure how they are going to move a lot of the average to lower quality hay that got baled this year, much of which got wet at least once.
