New Animal ID System Available in Missouri

The Missouri Department of Agriculture (MDA) announced on January 3rd, that producers across the state can begin to register their premises online with the Missouri Animal Identification Program (MAIP), the first step in establishing a national animal identification system.

Through voluntarily premises registration with MAIP, a unique identification number will be assigned to locations where animals are born, managed, marketed or exhibited. Information gathered through registration will be used solely by MDA and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) authorities for animal health purposes to ensure that disease investigations progress rapidly and efficiently.

Premises identification numbers can be immediately obtained by completing the registration process online at www.mda.mo.gov. To receive a printed registration form or additional information, contact the department's Animal Health Division at 573-751-7766.

Early Planning Grants Target Industry Growth

Applications are now being accepted for a second round of dairy Early Planning Grants. Existing dairy farmers, or individuals interested in starting an operation, are encouraged to apply. Recipients may be qualified to receive 75 percent of total costs for eligible projects, or a maximum of \$3,000. Eligible projects are limited to business planning activities. All applications must be received by Jan. 14, 2005.
