Farmers continue to make good progress harvesting hay. As a state we are about where we normally are this time of year with the first cutting of alfalfa and just a few days ahead of average with other types of hay. Although farmers are jumping with joy about the fact they are baling very high quality hay and getting most all hay baled dry. Some areas of the state are becoming very dry for this time of year as of Monday 28 percent of the top soil was ranked as short on moisture. Even with some locally heavy rains only 4 percent of the state's was noted as having surplus moisture. Some pastures are showing signs of the dryness as well. These factors have several farmers looking ahead and trying to gathering winter hay a bit earlier than usual.
