Prices of diesel fuel have dropped slightly but trucking expenses remain pretty steep. Hay demand is moderate to good on all hay except premium and supreme quality alfalfa, as most dairy farmers are currently using more good quality hay. Hay supply is moderate to light, however rains have at least for the time being offset much worry about the winter supply. Hay prices are steady this week.
