Most of the moisture that fell last week has been used up after the week of extreme heat. Despite several days with a heat index above the 100 degrees, farmers still had to bale hay. Hay harvest is advancing well according to National Ag Statistics Service, the second cutting of Alfalfa is 91 percent complete, the third cutting is 15 percent complete, other hay is at 94 percent, all slightly ahead of normal. Still some feeding being done as farmers try to save a little grass. Hay movement remains good for hay traveling to the southwest. Hay supply and demand are moderate and prices steady to firm.
