Missouri Weekly Hay Summary

According to the crop estimate report released Jan 23, as expected Missouri did lose hay acres in 2007, but total production was up by 584,000 tons for the 2006 year. Farmers managed to average 1.86 tons per acre. Despite a rise in production over 2006, in the past 20 years only 5 years have averaged lower yields per acre. A slight dip in cow numbers has provided a little relief to other farmers, but hay supply appears to be adequate for the rest of the feeding year. However hay producers are once again expected to start the new hay season with very little carry-over. Demand moderate, and prices steady.
