**Missouri Weekly Hay Summary**

Last year at this time some farmers were beginning to put corn in the ground but with the current ground temperatures and wet conditions, it's going to take some time before that happens this year. Pastures are starting to grow but need some days of sun before the spring shoot up really occurs. Extreme flood waters have gone down in most areas now allowing farmers to try and see how much damage was done. Many rivers reached new record levels and the fear now is that with everything saturated it wouldn't take much to be flooded again. Fertilizer costs are taking a major chunk from the farm budget at the very start this year so many farmers are not only hoping for but dependant on a good crop year if they wish to keep playing the game. It is still undetermined how many hay and pasture acres will be put into crops this year in Missouri, but in several states to the north there is talk that acres could be significant given the high grain prices. Hay movement has been moderate this week. Truckers have had to fight transportation issues. Feeding hasn't been easy either as options have been feed in the mud ruts that were made yesterday or make new ones today. Hay prices are steady, the supply and demand is moderate.
