Missouri Weekly Hay Summary

Wet conditions continue to prevent field work of any significance from taking place. To add insult to injury University Extension agents reported this week that the conditions are quite suitable for any army worm infestation, winds have brought the worms in moth stage and cool wet weather tends to promote their growth. NASS also released hay supply data this week confirming the amount of carry over hay. 81 percent of the state is rated as having an adequate supply with 14 percent rated as surplus. In the south east reason the surplus number jumps to 59 percent. Hay demand is light, supply moderate to heavy, and prices mostly steady. Wheat straw 2.00-4.00 small bale. **Missouri Crop Progress and Condition May 3, 2009 Agricultural Summary** Wet weather halted most spring tillage and planting, although progress continues about 1 week ahead of last year's near record late plantings. **Topsoil moisture** is 38 percent adequate and 62 percent surplus. Surplus topsoil moisture increased in all districts except the northwest and north-central districts. **Subsoil moisture** is 63 percent adequate and 37 percent surplus. **Spring tillage** is 51 percent complete, a 1 point increase from last week but 17 days behind the normal of 69 percent. There were **0.7 days suitable for fieldwork**. **Field Crops Report** Corn planting is 31 percent complete compared to 21 percent last year. Corn planting is 18 days behind the normal pace of 66 percent complete. Corn emergence is at 6 percent, on par with last year and 20 days behind normal. **Soybean** planting is 2 percent complete, 12 days behind the normal pace of 9 percent. **Wheat** heading is at 13 percent, 9 days behind the normal of 35 percent. Condition is rated 1 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 45 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. **Pasture & Livestock** Pasture condition is rated 4 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 50 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. **Hay supply** is rated at 5 percent short, 81 percent adequate, and 14 percent surplus.
