Missouri Fescue Seed Report

Rains prevented many from starting harvest over the weekend and early this week. With drier weather now in the forecast swathing machines have fired up and are beginning to roll. Reports of significant seed loss in areas of southwest MO due to hail and extremely hard rains have put a dampener on harvest outlook. One buyer stated in his 30 years in the business he could never recall losing this much seed just a few days prior to the start of harvest. Nearly all areas are preparing for trucks to begin arriving by weekend to early next week if the weather will allow, however buyers aren't expecting record amounts of seed as many feel its just not out there for one and secondly the low prices will keep several combines parked. The large amounts of carry over from last season seem likely to provide enough pressure to the market to offset those factors. Prices for the start of the season are steady. (Dry: Moisture 12-14% - Wet: Moisture greater than 14%) (Prices per lb.) Southwest, Northeast, Central, South Central, Northwest, and Southeast: .18 wet, .20 dry. **Week Ending June 14, 2009 Agricultural Summary** Wet weather continues to hinder crop progress. Although crop progress is about a week ahead of last year, it is still about one to two weeks behind normal. **Topsoil moisture** is 1 percent short, 60 percent adequate, and 39 percent surplus. **Spring tillage** is 93 percent complete, 11 days behind the normal of 96 percent. There were **2.7 days suitable for fieldwork**, similar to this week last year. The southern third of the State is reporting over 4 days suitable for fieldwork. **Field Crops Report** **Corn** planting is 97 percent complete. Corn emergence is at 92 percent, 9 days behind the normal of 96 percent. Corn condition is rated 2 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 45 percent good, and 9 percent excellent. Improving conditions in the east-central district were offset by worsening conditions in the north-central district. **Soybean** planting is 68 percent complete, 12 days behind the normal pace of 82 percent. Emergence is 52 percent, 11 days behind a normal of 70 percent. Soybean condition is 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 51 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. **Sorghum** planting is at 72 percent, 12 days behind the normal of 84 percent. **Wheat** heading is complete. Eighty-six percent of the wheat crop has turned color, 3 days behind the normal of 92 percent. The wheat harvest is 5 percent complete, 5 days behind the normal of 17 percent. Harvesting continues to progress in the southeast and has just begun in the north-central district. Condition is rated 1 percent very poor, 10 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 9 percent excellent. The first cutting of **alfalfa** is 74 percent complete, 7 days behind the normal of 84 percent. **Other hay** is 43 percent cut, 7 days behind the normal of 53 percent. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition is rated 2 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 19 percent excellent.
