Missouri Fescue Seed Report

Nearly all buying stations have wrapped up this years fescue seed harvest. The most two most common words used to describe this years season seem to be slow and uneventful. Several factors combined to result in this seasons light harvest, many of which have been discussed in previous reports this year. This years estimated harvest is reported to tally in the 30-35 million pound range about 1/3 of the amount harvested last year which was considered a slightly above average year. This will be the last fescue seed report for this harvest season, prices closed the year steady with the point they started. (Dry: Moisture 12-14% - Wet: Moisture greater than 14%) (Prices per lb.) All Regions: .18 wet, .20 dry.

Missouri Crop and Progress and Condition Report 06/28/09

Agricultural Summary Very warm, dry weather allowed producers to make substantial progress in planting soybeans and sorghum. Hay and winter wheat harvest also advanced significantly. **Topsoil moisture** was reduced to 14 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 15 percent surplus. There were 5.4 **days suitable for fieldwork** compared to 3.4 days during this week last year. **Field Crops Report** Corn silked is 8 percent complete, 8 days behind the normal of 27 percent. Corn condition is rated 3 percent very poor, 10 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 43 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. The west-central district showed a 13 point increase in good to excellent condition. **Soybean** planting is 90 percent complete, 5 days behind the normal pace of 93 percent. Plantings increased 15 points from last week. Emergence is 76 percent, 10 days behind a normal of 87 percent. Soybean blooming has begun in all areas but the southwest district. Soybean condition is 2 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 45 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. **Sorghum** planting is at 95 percent, 3 days ahead of the normal of 94 percent. Plantings increased 18 points over last week. Heading has begun in the north-central and central districts. Sorghum condition is rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 54 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. **Wheat** harvest is 58 percent complete, 3 days behind the normal of 67 percent. Harvest progressed 35 points compared to the normal of 25 points. The first cutting of **alfalfa** is 89 percent complete, while second cutting is 21 percent complete, 7 days behind the normal of 38 percent. **Other hay** is 63 percent cut, 7 days behind the normal of 73 percent. Other hay cut increased 13 points this week compared to the normal of 9 points. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition is rated 2 percent poor, 25 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 15 percent excellent
