Missouri Crop Progress and Condition Report (07/02/09) Agricultural Summary Unseasonably cool temperatures have crops progressing slowly in some parts across the State. State-wide, **topsoil moisture** is rated 1 percent very short, 16 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. **Subsoil moisture** is rated 1 percent very short, 8 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus, virtually unchanged from last month. There were 5.3 **days suitable for fieldwork**. **Field Crops Report** Corn silking is 88 percent complete, 3 days ahead of last year but 8 days behind a normal of 95 percent. Forty-five percent of the corn is in dough stage, 7 days ahead of last year but 5 days behind normal. Corn dented is 10 percent complete, 5 days ahead of last year but 4 days behind normal. Corn condition is rated 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 15 percent excellent. **Soybean** blooming is at 61 percent, 7 days ahead of last year but 5 days behind a normal of 70 percent. Twenty percent are setting pods, 3 days ahead of last year and 8 days behind normal. Soybean condition is rated 3 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. **Sorghum** heading is 38 percent, 3 days behind a year ago and 11 days behind a normal of 66 percent. Sorghum turning color is 6 percent complete, 2 days ahead of last year but 5 days behind normal. Sorghum condition is rated 4 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 50 percent good, and 9 percent excellent. The second cutting of **alfalfa** is 91 percent complete, while the third cutting is 15 percent complete, two weeks behind normal. **Other hay** is 93 percent cut, 6 days behind normal. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition is rated 5 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 9 percent excellent. Pasture condition of poor to very poor are at 5 percent compared to the average of 39 percent.
