Statewide, topsoil moisture Topsoil moisture rated adequate to surplus is 88 percent compared to 62 percent last year and a normal of 59 percent. There were 5.6 days suitable for fieldwork. Field Crops Report Ninety-one percent of the corn is in the dough stage, 7 day ahead of last year but 7 days behind normal. Corn dent is 66 percent complete, 5 days ahead of last year but 10 days behind the normal of 82 percent. Thirteen percent of the corn is mature, 4 days ahead of last year but 14 days behind a normal of 42 percent. Corn condition is rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 27 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Soybean blooming is at 95 percent, 8 days ahead of last year but 7 days behind a normal of 98 percent. Eighty-one percent are setting pods, 9 days ahead of last year but 6 days behind normal. Soybeans turning color is 4 percent, 8 days behind the normal of 13 percent. Some soybeans have begun to drop leaves. Sudden Death Syndrome (SDS) was reported in soybeans in the west-central and east-central districts. Soybean condition is rated 3 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 14 percent excellent. **Sorghum** heading is 87 percent, 13 days behind a normal of 95 percent. Sorghum turning color is 42 percent complete, 10 days behind normal. Sorghum mature is at 10 percent, 3 days behind normal. Sorghum condition is rated 4 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.
