**Crop Progress and Condition Week Ending 05/02/10 Agricultural Summary**

Weekend rains for the second week in a row have slowed fieldwork and delayed planting in many areas of the State, although planting is still ahead of normal for most field crops. **Topsoil moisture** was rated 1 percent short, 50 percent adequate, and 49 percent surplus. **Subsoil moisture** was rated 2 percent short, 70 percent adequate, and 28 percent surplus. There were 2.1 **days suitable for fieldwork**. **Spring tillage** advanced to 73 percent complete, just over 20 days ahead of last year's 51 percent and 12 days ahead of the 5-year average of 63 percent complete. **Field Crops Report** **Corn** planting averaged 73 percent complete. This is still 20 days ahead of last year's 30 percent and almost 14 days ahead of the normal of 53 percent complete. Corn emerged was 39 percent, almost 17 days ahead of last year and 5 days ahead of normal. **Soybean** planting averaged 7 percent complete, 12 days ahead of last year and 2 days ahead of normal. **Winter wheat** was 19 percent headed. This is 4 days ahead of last year, but 4 days behind normal. Wheat condition was rated 10 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 32 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. The wheat crop is in poorer condition than last year with 26 percent poor to very poor compared to 9 percent last year. **Pasture & Livestock** **Pasture** condition slightly improved to 1 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 41 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. **Supply of hay and other roughages** was rated 1 percent very short, 13 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Hay supplies are shorter than a year ago due to the cold, wet winter. **Stock water supplies** were rated 81 percent adequate and 19 percent surplus.
