Crop Progress and Condition 05/30/10 Agricultural Summary

Warmer, drier weather allowed farmers to make progress with tillage, planting and harvesting hay until spotty showers again limited fieldwork. **Topsoil moisture** was rated 3 percent short, 81 percent adequate and 16 percent surplus. There were 4.8 **days suitable for fieldwork**. **Spring tillage** was 89 percent complete, 6 days ahead of last year's 84 percent, but virtually the same as the 5-year average. **Field Crops Report: Corn** planting averaged 95 percent complete. This is 8 days ahead of last year's 89 percent and 4 days ahead of normal. Corn emerged reached 81 percent, a week ahead of last year's 70 percent but similar to normal. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 41 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. Farmers made good progress with **soybean** planting reported as 48 percent complete, up 26 points from last week. This is 3 days ahead of last year's 41 percent but still 5 days behind the normal of 59 percent. The soybean crop was 22 percent emerged Statewide, 1 day ahead of last year, but nearly 6 days behind normal. **Winter wheat** averaged 91 percent headed, 2 days behind last year and 5 days behind normal. Wheat condition was rated 10 percent very poor, 24 percent poor, 34 percent fair, 28 percent good, and 4 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from a week earlier. First cutting of **alfalfa** was 45 percent complete the same as a year ago but over 4 days behind normal. The second cutting of alfalfa is beginning in the Bootheel. **Other hay** was 22 percent cut.
