Missouri Fescue Seed Report

Week ending 06/11/2010 Buying stations are gearing up and preparing for Fescue Season. Generally most locations are expecting seed cutting to start in a week to ten days. The potential for a decent harvest exist fields look to have an average amount of seed but heavy rains have begin to mat down some fields which could make harvesting difficult. The rains have prevented some farmers from haying ground which could lead to more acres harvested if farmers still haven't been able to hay by the time seed is ready for cutting. Preseason prices are reported as steady with the end of last season with an average amount of carryover from last year and a decent potential harvest possible there just are not enough factors to sway the market one way or the other at the current time. (Dry: Moisture 12-14% - Wet: Moisture greater than 14%) (Prices per lb.) Southwest, Northeast, Central, South Central, Northwest, and Southeast: .18 wet, .20 dry **Crop Progress and Condition 06/06/10 Agricultural Summary** Wet conditions in the northern third of the State limited fieldwork in those areas. There were 4.3 days suitable for fieldwork. Spring tillage was 94 percent complete, 10 days ahead of last year's 90 percent and 4 days ahead of normal. **Field Crops Report: Corn** emerged reached 92 percent, 8 days ahead last year's 82 percent and 3 days ahead of the normal of 89 percent. Corn condition was rated 5 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. **Soybean** planting was reported as 65 percent complete, up 17 points from last week. This is 6 days ahead of last year's 57 percent, but still 3 days behind the normal of 70 percent. The soybean crop was 41 percent emerged Statewide, 3 days ahead of last year, but just over 5 days behind normal. Soybean condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. **Sorghum** planting was 70 percent complete, up 17 points from last week. This is a week ahead of last year, but 2 days behind normal. **Winter wheat** averaged 96 percent headed, a day behind last year and 6 days behind normal. Sixty-seven percent of the wheat is turning color, up 32 points from a week earlier. This is just over 2 days ahead of last year, but similar to normal. Wheat harvest has just begun in the Bootheel. Wheat condition was rated 10 percent very poor, 24 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 28 percent good, and 5 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from a week earlier. First cutting of **alfalfa** was 61 percent complete, a day behind last year and 5 days behind normal. The second cutting of alfalfa is 5 percent complete Statewide, 15 days ahead of a year earlier and a week ahead of normal. **Other hay** was 36 percent cut, the same as last year, but 3 days behind normal.
