Missouri Fescue Seed Report

Week ending 06/24/10 As was expected fescue cutting has reached its peak in the past week and is now on the downhill side in all the major cutting areas of the state. Several spots saw some significant seed loss from various pop up storms and heavy winds before farmers could manage to get seed cut. Seed yields have been extremely variable from field to field. Some locations reported a very noticeable decrease in number of combines running and the acreage cut due in part to low seed prices. Some stations plan to call it a season once through the upcoming weekend others will stay open to pick up the last few lbs of seed cut, but after the weekend the 2010 harvest season will more or less be complete. Prices are reported as steady with last week. Prices are reported as steady with last week. (Dry: Moisture 12-14% - Wet: Moisture greater than 14%) (Prices per lb.) Southwest, Northeast, Central, South Central, Northwest, and Southeast: .18 wet, .20 dry. **Crop Progress and Condition 06/20/10 Agricultural Summary** While dry conditions affect the southern third of the State, continued wet conditions in the northern two-thirds of the State again limited fieldwork in those areas. **Topsoil moisture** was rated 3 percent very short, 21 percent short, 44 percent adequate and 32 percent surplus. In the northern third of the State and central district, corn and soybean conditions were rated 14 percent or more poor to very poor. **Field Crops Report: Corn** silked and beyond was 9 percent complete, 8 days ahead of last year and 2 days ahead of normal. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 14 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 10 percent excellent. **Soybean** planting was reported as 79 percent complete, 3 days ahead of last year's 74 percent, but still 5 days behind the normal of 84 percent. **Sorghum** planting was 84 percent complete, just over 3 days ahead of last year, but a day behind normal. Sorghum is just beginning to head. Sorghum condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. **Winter wheat** turning color was 93 percent complete, up 14 points from a week earlier. This is similar to last year, but 4 days behind normal. Wheat harvest was 43 percent complete. Dry conditions in the Bootheel has led to rapid progress in the wheat harvest, which was 88 percent harvested. Wheat condition was rated 9 percent very poor, 23 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 30 percent good, and 6 percent excellent.
