Missouri Weekly Hay Summary- Week ending 07/16/10

Heat indexes pushing well past the three digit mark covered the state this week. Many farmers got back to the fields adding to the total acres of hay harvested this year. According to the estimated crop production report released last week, farmers are expected to harvest more acres this year which is no surprise as many entered the year with little to no carryover the mind set to rebuild supplies. The additional acres were added as mixed grass hay as the states alfalfa harvest is expected to decline. The supply of hay is moderate, demand moderate, and prices steady. Crop Progress and Condition 07/11/10 Although general rainfall over most of the State slowed fieldwork, some areas missed some much needed precipitation. There were 3.7 **days suitable for fieldwork**. **Topsoil moisture** was rated 7 percent very short, 10 percent short, 68 percent adequate and 15 percent surplus. **Field Crops Report:** Corn silked and beyond was 60 percent complete, nearly a week ahead of last year, but similar to the 5-year average (normal). Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 36 percent good, and 14 percent excellent, a similar to a week earlier. Ninety-seven percent of the **soybean** acreage has emerged, 3 days ahead of last year and 4 days ahead of normal. Soybean blooming and beyond was 21 percent complete, 4 days ahead of last year, but a day behind normal. **Winter wheat** harvest was 98 percent complete, 3 days ahead of last year and 8 days ahead of normal. Harvest in the north-west district is behind the rest of the State, with 81 percent complete. The second cutting of **alfalfa** was 64 percent complete, up 13 points from last week, and the third cutting of alfalfa was at 5 percent complete. The progress of both crops was similar to normal, but ahead of last year.
