#### Missouri Weekly Hay Summary- Week ending 07/23/10

Weather this week again impacting hay production as rains over the weekend and early week slowed progress. The first cutting of grass hay has been completed, and even though tonnage may be up quality is a major concern. Only those south of I-70 getting the early grass hay up with little or no rain on the windrows. Third cutting of alfalfa has started and with a little luck and some drier weather this will be finished shortly. The supply of hay is moderate, demand moderate, and prices steady. Topsoil moisture was rated 5 percent very short, 13 percent short, 63 percent adequate and 19 percent surplus. Field Crops Report: Corn silked and beyond was 88 percent complete, 8 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of the 5-year average (normal). Thirty-seven percent of the corn was in the dough stage, just over 5 days ahead of last year and 2 days ahead of normal. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 15 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 10 percent excellent, similar to a week earlier. Sovbean blooming and beyond was 52 percent complete, just over 4 days ahead of last year and a day ahead of normal. Soybean condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 12 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 8 percent excellent, similar to last week. Sorghum headed and beyond moved to 37 percent complete, just over a week ahead of last year, but 2 days behind normal Sorghum condition was rated 3 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 49 percent good, and 13 percent excellent. The second cutting of alfalfa was 86 percent complete. This is 3 days ahead of last year, but just behind normal. The third cutting of alfalfa, up 12 points, was 28 percent complete. This is just over 14 days ahead of last year and 4 days ahead of normal.
