Oppressive heat ,even with high humidity, this past week allowed most hay producers to continue harvest. Many starting to cut the second cutting of grass hay. Ample moisture after the first cutting has allowed for rapid growth of the summer grasses, and quality is very good, most are even surprised as to the amount of hay that there is. Some movement of hay starting in the very southern and southeast parts of the state as they are extremely dry and some cattle producers are being forced to supplemental feed forages. The supply of hay is moderate, demand moderate, and prices steady. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 10 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from a week earlier. **Soybean** condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 15 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 7 percent excellent, similar to a week ago. **Sorghum:** Sorghum condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 3 percent excellent, an improvement from a week earlier. The second cutting of **alfalfa** was 93 percent complete. The third cutting of alfalfa was 52 percent complete. **Other hay** was 95 percent cut, similar to last year, but 6 days behind normal.
