Missouri Weekly Hay Summary- Week ending 08/13/10

A cold front that passed over Missouri this past week finally broke the streak of three digit heat indexes. Man and beast are very hopeful that this is also the last of extremely high temperatures for the year. Conditions to the south continue to decline with each passing day and many are praying for a good amount of moisture and some fall pastures. The supply of hay is moderate, demand moderate, and prices steady. Corn maturing was 5 percent complete, 6 days ahead of last year but 4 days behind normal. Corn condition was rated 5 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 9 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from a week earlier. **Soybean:** Soybean condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 14 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 41 percent good, and 8 percent excellent, slightly better than a week ago. **Sorghum:** Sorghum condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 6 percent excellent, similar to a week earlier. The second cutting of **alfalfa** was 97 percent complete. This is the same as last year but 3 days behind normal. The third cutting of alfalfa was 61 percent complete. This is a week ahead of last year but similar to normal. **Other hay** was 96 percent cut, 3 days behind last year and 10 days behind normal.
