**Missouri Weekly Hay Summary- Week ending 09/10/10**

The majority of farmers have now put hay equipment up for the year as many are now thinking o grain harvest. Farmers in the southern half of the state have welcomed rains in hope for a revitalization of pastures. Many have been force to cull some of the herd in south central MO as that area has seen the most prolonged dry spell and made the decision to cut the herd rather than truck in hay to feed easier. The supply of hay is moderate, demand light to moderate, and prices steady. Rains in the southwest and south-central regions should alleviate some of the drought conditions. **Top-soil moisture supplies** were rated 13 percent very short, 16 percent short, 67 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus, an improvement from last week. Corn was 51 percent mature, just over 14 days ahead of last year and slightly ahead of normal. Sixteen percent of the corn had been harvested, 19 days ahead of last year and just over 2 days ahead of normal. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 38 percent good, and 10 percent excellent, unchanged from week earlier. Ninety-four percent of the **soybeans** had set pods and beyond, 8 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal. Soybean condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 15 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 38 percent good, and 9 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from last week. Sorghum harvested was 6 percent complete, 21 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal. Sorghum condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 4 percent excellent, similar to a week earlier. The third cutting of **alfalfa** was 92 percent complete Statewide. This is a week ahead of last year and 9 days ahead of normal.
