**Missouri Weekly Hay Summary- Week ending 09/17/10**

Wet weather kept farmers out of the fields for most of the week. A slight cool spell with a few foggy mornings hint that fall is just around the corner. There has been a few loads of hay being sold but, as is typical in the state, few beef interest will come into the market until snow flies. Dairy hay continues to see pressure given the price of milk. The supply of hay is moderate, demand light to moderate, and prices steady. Good to Premium quality Brome 90.00-150.00; Good quality Brome 50.00-120.00 Fair quality Brome some mixed with grass 30.00-50.00 per large round bale Good to Premium Mixed Grass hay 60.00-100.00 Good quality Mixed Grass hay 40.00-70.00 Fair to Good quality Mixed Grass hay 20.00-40.00 per large round bale Wheat straw 2.00-5.00 per small square bale. **Crop Progress and Condition 09/12/10 Field Crops Report** The corn crop was 94 percent dented, 2 weeks ahead of last year and 5 days ahead of the 5-year average (normal). Corn was 65 percent mature, over 13 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal. Twenty-three percent of the corn has been harvested, 18 days ahead of last year and similar to normal. Corn condition was rated 7 percent very poor, 17 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 37 percent good, and 9 percent excellent, slightly poorer than a week earlier. Respondents are reporting **corn moisture at harvest** between 13.2 percent and 21.7 percent with a State average of 18.7 percent. Ninety-seven percent of the **soybeans** have set pods and beyond, a week ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal. Soybean condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 13 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 38 percent good, and 10 percent excellent, virtually unchanged from last week. **Sorghum** harvested was 12 percent complete, 21 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal. Sorghum condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 6 percent excellent, similar to a week earlier. The third cutting of **alfalfa** was 94 percent complete Statewide. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition was rated 11 percent very poor, 14 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 34 percent good, and 5 percent excellent, a slight improvement from last week. A substantial improvement was seen in the southwest district, which was rated 12 percent poor to very poor compared with 38 percent a week earlier. Although improvement was seen in the south-central and southeast districts, pasture condition is still rated 73 and 79 percent poor to very poor in those areas.
