The supply of hay is moderate, demand light to moderate, and prices steady. Good to Premium quality Brome 90.00-150.00; Good quality Brome 50.00-120.00 Fair quality Brome some mixed with grass 30.00-50.00 per large round bale Good to Premium Mixed Grass hay 60.00-100.00 Good quality Mixed Grass hay 40.00-70.00 Fair to Good quality Mixed Grass hay 20.00-40.00 per large round bale Wheat straw 2.00-5.00 per small square bale. **Crop Progress and Condition 10/11/10** Warmer than average temperatures and little to no rain caused crops to mature more rapidly than normal and allowed farmers to make significant progress with over 1.5 million acres harvested. There were 6.9 days suitable for fieldwork statewide. A further decline in topsoil moisture was seen this week as supplies were rated 10 percent very short, 22 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. **Fall tillage** was 30 percent complete, 38 days ahead of last year and 19 days ahead of the 5-year average (normal). **Field Crops Report: Corn** harvest advanced more rapidly than normal to reach 74 percent Statewide, 39 days ahead of last year and 18 days ahead of normal. The northwest, northeast, and west-central districts progressed more than 20 points from last week. . Nearly all the soybeans have turned color and leaves have dropped on 84 percent of the crop, up 20 points from last week. This is 9 days ahead of last year and 2 days ahead of normal. Soybean maturity, up 28 points from a week earlier, reached 67 percent, over 8 days ahead of last year and 2 days ahead of the normal pace. Soybean harvest was 36 percent complete, 22 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal. **Sorghum** has reached 92 percent maturity, 3 weeks ahead of last year and 13 days ahead of normal. Sorghum harvest was 57 percent complete, 30 days ahead of last year and nearly 10 days ahead of normal. The northwest, central, and southwest districts advancement more than 20 points from a week earlier. Sorghum condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 6 percent excellent, similar to last week. Planting of **winter wheat** was 29 percent complete, 25 days ahead of last year and 2 days ahead of normal. Six percent of the wheat crop has emerged, 2 days ahead of last year but 2 days behind normal.
