**Week Ending June 19, 2011 Agricultural Summary**

Rainstorms traveled across the state dropping hail and some much needed precipitation. There were 4.6 **days suitable for fieldwork** statewide with the northeast district limited to 2.1 days suitable. **Topsoil moisture** was 3 percent very short, 15 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 16 percent surplus. This was very similar to last week statewide, although the east-central and southeast districts showed the greatest improvement from last week in topsoil moisture. **Field Crops Report** At 99 percent, **corn** emergence was nearly complete, 3 days ahead of last year, and 1 week ahead of the 5-year historic average (normal). Corn condition improved from last week to with 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 25 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. However, **soybean** condition remained very similar to last week with 1 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 9 percent excellent. Soybean planting progressed 11 points from last week to 88 percent, 1 week ahead of last year and normal. Soybean emergence was 76 percent, 6 days ahead of last year, and 5 days ahead of normal. **Sorghum** was 83 percent planted, 1 day behind 2010, but 1 day ahead of normal. Sorghum condition was 32 percent fair, 65 percent good, and 3 percent excellent. At 99 percent, **winter wheat** turning color was nearly complete. The winter wheat harvest progressed to 25 percent with most progress made in the southern districts. Wheat condition remained very similar to last week with 9 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 10 percent excellent. Rain slowed **alfalfa hay** 1st cutting, moving 7 points from last week to 85 percent, 10 days ahead of last year, and 2 days ahead of normal. Alfalfa hay 2nd cutting was 13 percent, 6 days behind last year, but 1 day ahead of normal with most progress made in the southwest and southeast districts. Similarly **other hay** moved 11 points from last week to 55 percent, 2 days ahead of last year, but the same as normal. **Pasture & Livestock** Rain helped **pastures** slightly improving condition to 4 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. **Weather Summary** Much needed **precipitation** averaged 1.62 inches statewide. Hail and high winds were reported. Back flooding from the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers remained a concern for producers. **Temperatures** cooled from last week, averaging 2 degrees below average to 2 degrees above average statewide.
