Week Ending October 2, 2011 Agricultural Summary Dry weather over much of the state allowed farmers to harvest over 1 million acres. Statewide there were 6.7 **days suitable for fieldwork** with 4 districts reporting a full week available but only 5.7 days suitable in the southeast district. **Topsoil moisture** fell significantly from last week to 25 percent very short, 41 percent short, and 34 percent adequate, but **subsoil moisture** was very similar to last month with 20 percent very short, 40 percent short, 39 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. At 19 percent, **ground worked fall tillage** remained 2 days ahead of last year, and 12 days ahead of the historic 5-year average (normal). **Off-farm storage availability** was 7 percent short, 88 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus. The northwest remained 18 percent short due to early season flooding. **On-farm storage availability** was 11 percent short, 82 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. **Field Crops Report** **Corn** mature was 98 percent, 4 days earlier than last year. Corn harvested was 66 percent, 4 days ahead of last year, and 11 days ahead of normal. At 68 percent, the northeast district was 29 points ahead of last year. The dry weather lowered **corn moisture at harvest** to 16.6 percent statewide, ranging from 12 percent in the southwest to 17.6 percent in the north-central. **Soybeans** turning color and beyond were 88 percent, 2 days ahead of last year, and 3 days earlier than normal. Soybeans dropping leaves and beyond were 63 percent, 1 day earlier than last year and normal. Soybeans mature were 37 percent, 1 day ahead of last year and normal. Soybeans harvested were 11 percent, nearly the same as last year and normal. Soybean condition improved from last week to 12 percent very poor, 21 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 30 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. **Sorghum** turning color and beyond was nearly complete at 99 percent, 8 days ahead of last year, and 13 days ahead of normal. Sorghum mature was 66 percent, 11 days behind last year, and 1 day behind normal. Sorghum harvested was 27 percent, 5 days behind 2010. Sorghum condition was 7 percent very poor, 19 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 34 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Winter wheat** planted was 8 percent, 2 days behind last year, and 1 day behind normal. Winter wheat emerged was 2 percent, the same as last year and 1 day behind normal. **Pasture & Livestock** The dry weather was not kind to livestock producers with **pasture conditions** continuing to decline to 23 percent very poor, 25 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 18 percent good, and 1 percent excellent, slowing hay and pasture growth. **Supply of hay and other roughages** were 6 percent very short, 23 percent short, 69 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus.
