Week Ending October 23, 2011 Agricultural Summary Northern districts as well as the west-central district remained dry while the central and southern districts received some moisture. Harvest progress was aided by 6.2 **days suitable for fieldwork** statewide. **Topsoil moisture supply** improved slightly from last week but remained very dry with 44 percent very short, 33 percent short, 22 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. All northern districts as well as the west-central district were greater than 60 percent very short. **Fall tillage** was 48 percent, 2 days behind last year, but 13 days ahead of normal. **Off-farm storage availability** was 9 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus, the same as last week. The west-central district was 21 percent surplus, but the northwest, with 23 percent short, continued to be impacted by the mid-season flooding. **On-farm storage availability** was 14 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus, also the same as last week. The northeast district was 24 percent short followed by the central district at 21 percent short. **Field Crops Report** Corn harvested was 93 percent, 6 days ahead of last year, and 1 month ahead of normal with the northwest district increasing 11 points from last week. **Soybeans** dropping leaves were 97 percent. Soybeans mature were 89 percent, 3 days behind last year, but 3 days ahead of normal. Soybeans harvested were 70 percent, moving 16 points from last week. This was 2 days behind last year, but 10 days ahead of normal. **Winter wheat** planted was 60 percent, 4 days behind last year, but 6 days ahead of normal. Winter wheat emergence was 31 percent, 1 day behind last year, but 3 days ahead of normal. Emergence in the south-central, the northwest, and northeast districts was 56, 54, and 42 percent, but rain was needed for good establishment in the north. Winter wheat condition was 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 60 percent fair, 33 percent good, and 1 percent excellent. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** conditions were 33 percent very poor, 29 percent poor, 27 percent fair, and 11 percent good. **Stock water supplies** were 12 percent very short, 36 percent short, 51 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Hay feeding was prevalent across much of the state, and some producers began to worry about winter hay supplies. **Weather Summary** Temperatures were 4 to 6 degrees below normal with some nightly lows slightly below freezing. **Precipitation** averaged 0.55 of an inch at the state level.
