**Week Ending November 6, 2011 Agricultural Summary** Precipitation limited harvest and fieldwork with only 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork statewide. Swinging 27 points from last week, **topsoil moisture** increased to 19 percent very short, 43 percent short, 37 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Topsoil moisture rated adequate and surplus increased 49 points in the west-central district and 37 points in the north-east district. **Ground worked fall tillage** was 69 percent, 4 days behind last year, but 16 days ahead of normal. **Off-farm storage availability** was 12 percent short, 84 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. **On-farm storage availability** was 16 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 8 percent surplus. **Field Crops Report Soybeans** harvested were 91 percent, 5 days behind last year, but 10 days ahead of normal. **Cotton** harvested was 89 percent, 17 days behind last year, but 11 days ahead of normal. **Sorghum** harvested was 90 percent, 11 days behind last year, but 11 days ahead of normal. **Winter wheat** planted was 89 percent, 6 days behind last year, but 16 days ahead of normal. Wheat emergence was 66 percent, 2 days behind last year, but 9 days ahead of normal. Winter wheat condition was 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 48 percent fair, 43 percent good, and 1 percent excellent. Precipitation later in the week helped wheat emergence. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture condition** improved slightly from the precipitation to 33 percent very poor, 30 percent poor, 26 percent fair, and 11 percent good. **Stock water supplies** were 14 percent very short, 39 percent short, 46 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. More rain was needed to recover from drought conditions. **Supply of hay and other roughages** was 7 percent very short, 30 percent short, 61 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Winter hay supplies were a concern for some producers. **Weather Summary Temperatures** were 1 degree below normal in the south-central and southeast districts, and the rest of the state was 2 to 4 degrees above average. **Precipitation** averaged 0.98 of an inch with the north-central, northeast, west-central, and central districts averaging over an inch.
