**Agricultural Summary-Week ending 06/24/2012**

The western border of the state received some rainfall last week, but the central and eastern districts remained dry. There were 6.2 **days suitable for fieldwork**. **Topsoil moisture** declined to 51 percent very short, 36 percent short, and 13 percent adequate. The central, east-central, and south-central districts were greater than 60 percent very short. **Subsoil moisture** also declined to 44 percent very short, 41 percent short, and 15 percent adequate. **Field Crops Report** Corn silked was 35 percent, 2 weeks ahead of last year, and 12 days ahead of normal (5-year average). Corn developed to the dough stage in 5 districts. Corn condition was 9 percent very poor, 17 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 31 percent good, and 3 percent excellent. Five districts rate greater than 1/3 poor to very poor. **Soybeans** emergence was 93 percent, 13 days ahead of last year, and 17 days ahead of normal. Soybean blooming and beyond was 4 percent, 9 days ahead of last year and 7 days ahead of normal. Soybean condition was 11 percent very poor, 24 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 24 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Cotton** squaring and beyond was 50 percent, 6 days ahead of last year and normal. Cotton setting bolls and beyond was 5 percent, 11 days ahead of last year, and 3 days ahead of normal. Cotton condition was 8 percent very poor, 27 percent poor, 44 percent fair, 19 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Sorghum** headed began in 4 districts. Sorghum condition was 5 percent very poor, 19 percent poor, 44 percent fair, 30 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Winter wheat** harvest was 97 percent complete, 16 days ahead of last year, and 23 days ahead of normal. **Alfalfa hay** 2nd cutting was 71 percent, 18 days ahead of last year, and 23 days ahead of normal. Alfalfa hay 3rd cutting was 7 percent, 23 and 24 days ahead of last year and normal. **Other hay** cut was 91 percent, 24 days ahead of last year, and 33 days ahead of normal. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition continued to decline to 26 percent very poor, 32 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 12 percent good. This was well below the 5-year average of 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 51 percent good, and 10 percent excellent. **Supply of hay and other roughages** declined to 14 percent very short, 34 percent short, 50 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. **Stock water supplies** also declined to 16 percent very short, 34 percent short, 48 percent adequate, and 2 percent excellent.
