Week Ending November 3, 2013 Agricultural Summary Rains limited harvest progress across the State. There were 3.2 **days suitable for field-work**. **Topsoil moisture supply** was 4 percent very short, 20 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus. The topsoil rated adequate and surplus increased 34 points from last week. **Subsoil moisture supply** was 14 percent very short, 37 percent short, 48 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. The subsoil rated adequate and surplus increased 15 points from last week. **Fall tillage** was 42 percent complete, 23 days behind last year and 7 days behind normal (5-year average). **Field Crops Report** **Corn** harvested was 82 percent complete, 39 days behind last year but same as normal. **Corn moisture at harvest** was 16.5 percent, ranging from 13.9 percent in the southwest district to 17.6 percent in the south-central district. **Soybeans** mature were 93 percent, 2 days behind last year and 2 days behind normal. Soybeans harvested were 64 percent complete, 5 days behind last year and 4 days behind normal. **Cotton** opening bolls was 96 percent complete, 30 days behind last year and 15 days behind normal. Cotton harvested was 46 percent complete, 21 days behind last year and 19 days behind normal. Cotton condition was 4 percent very poor, 17 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 44 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Rice** harvested was 97 percent complete, 11 days behind last year but 4 days ahead of normal. **Sorghum** harvested was 70 percent complete, 9 days behind last year and 2 days behind normal. **Winter wheat** planting was 64 percent complete, 8 days behind last year and 2 days behind normal. Winter wheat emerged was 43 percent, 7 days behind last year and 4 days behind normal. Winter wheat condition was 1 percent poor, 49 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition was 3 percent very poor, 17 percent poor, 49 percent fair, 29 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Supply of hay and other roughages** was 1 percent very short, 8 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. **Stock water supplies** were 1 percent very short, 16 percent short, 81 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Weather Summary **Temperatures** were 1 degree below average to 3 degrees above average across the state. Precipitation averaged 2.30 inches statewide. The west-central districted received 3.39 inches. Vernon County reported 5.11 inches.
