Missouri Crop Progress and Condition Report
06/02/2014

Warm, dry conditions last week allowed field activities to continue throughout the state. There were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork during the week ending June 1. Statewide average temperature was 73.9 degrees, which is 6.4 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.67 inches statewide, with most areas reporting some rain. Corn planting progressed to 99 percent complete, up 13 percentage points from last year. Corn emerged progressed to 95 percent which is 25 percentage points ahead of last year and 12 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 26 percent short, 67 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 10 percent very short, 34 percent short, 55 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Winter wheat progressed to 96 percent headed. Winter wheat condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 46 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. Soybean planting progressed to 76 percent complete, compared to 35 percent last year and 53 percent for the 5-year average. Soybeans emerged progressed to 56 percent, up 22 percentage points from last week. Rice planting progressed to 98 percent complete. Rice emerged progressed to 88 percent. Cotton planting progressed to 97 percent complete. Pasture condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 13 percent poor, 48 percent fair, 35 percent good, and 3 percent excellent.
