Missouri Crop Progress and Condition Report
06/16/2014

Widespread precipitation slowed planting and hay cutting, with the state averaging 1.57 inches of rain for the week ending June 15. There were 2.4 days suitable for fieldwork during the week. Statewide temperatures averaged 67.1 degrees, 5.3 degrees below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 10 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 21 percent short, 67 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Corn condition was rated 71 percent good to excellent. Winter wheat progressed to 78 percent turning color, up 17 percentage points from last week. Winter wheat condition was rated 53 percent good to excellent. Soybean planting progressed to 86 percent complete. Soybeans emerged progressed to 79 percent. Soybean condition was rated 66 percent good to excellent. Cotton squaring progressed to 19 percent complete. Pasture condition was rated 9 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 46 percent good, and 4 percent excellent.
