Missouri Crop Progress and Condition July 28, 2014

There were 6.4 days suitable for fieldwork during the week ending July 27. Statewide, temperatures averaged 76.6 degrees for the week, which is 1.1 degrees below normal. The state average for rainfall was 0.28 inches. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent very short, 34 percent short, 59 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 31 percent short, 62 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Corn silking progressed to 96 percent, 20 percentage points ahead of last year and 10 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Corn in the dough stage progressed to 33 percent. Corn condition was rated 84 percent good to excellent. Soybeans blooming progressed to 63 percent. Soybeans setting pods progressed to 23 percent, 18 percentage points ahead of last year and 8 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Soybean condition was rated 76 percent good to excellent. Cotton squaring progressed to 89 percent complete. Cotton setting bolls progressed to 48 percent, 25 percentage points ahead of last week, but 8 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Pasture condition was rated 8 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 45 percent good, and 6 percent excellent.
