Missouri Crop Progress and Condition

Corn harvest began on a limited basis and hay cutting continued to progress. Temperatures averaged 71.0 degrees, 5.2 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.34 inches statewide, 0.63 inches above normal. There were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending August 23. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 11 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 18 percent surplus. Corn in the dough stage reached 90 percent, 4 percentage points behind the previous year but equal to the 5-year average. Corn dented reached 64 percent, 3 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn mature reached 7 percent, 15 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybean blooming progressed to 80 percent, 19 percentage points behind the previous year and 14 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans setting pods reached 52 percent, 28 percent points behind the previous year and 22 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Cotton setting bolls reached 74 percent complete, compared to 93 percent last year and 96 percent for the 5-year average. Pasture condition was rated 2 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 54 percent good, and 12 percent excellent.
