**Missouri Crop Progress and Condition**

Warmer temperatures and below average precipitation allowed for corn harvesting to progress. There were 6.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending September 6. Temperatures averaged 79.6 degrees, 6.0 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.09 inches statewide, 0.62 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 32 percent short, 57 percent adequate, and 8 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 18 percent short, 70 percent adequate, and 11 percent surplus. Corn in the dough stage reached 97 percent, 3 percentage points behind the previous year and 2 percentage point behind the 5-year average. Corn dented reached 86 percent, 4 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn mature reached 38 percent, 13 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn harvest was 7 percent complete, 11 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybean blooming progressed to 93 percent, 7 percentage points behind the previous year and 6 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans setting pods reached 80 percent, 11 percentage points behind the previous year and 13 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans dropping leaves progressed to 3 percent. Cotton setting bolls reached 99 percent complete, compared to 97 percent last year and equal to the 5-year average. Cotton bolls opening progressed to 21 percent complete, 16 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Rice harvest was 2 percent complete. Sorghum harvest was 5 percent complete. Pasture condition was rated 3 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 49 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.
