Missouri Crop Progress and Condition

Corn harvesting continued but was slowed by midweek rains. The rain was welcomed in pastures and late planted soybean fields. There were 4.8 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending September 13. Temperatures averaged 70.2 degrees, 1.0 degree below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.94 inches statewide, 1.01 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 23 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 8 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 15 percent short, 75 percent adequate, and 9 percent surplus. Corn dented reached 93 percent, 2 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn mature reached 54 percent, 12 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn harvest was 14 percent complete, 12 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybean blooming progressed to 96 percent, 4 percentage points behind the previous year and 3 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans setting pods reached 89 percent, 2 percentage points behind the previous year and 6 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans dropping leaves progressed to 9 percent. Sorghum harvest was 6 percent complete, 1 percentage point behind the 5-year average. Cotton bolls opening progressed to 35 percent, 13 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Pasture condition was rated 3 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.
