Missouri Crop Progress and Condition

Another dry week across Missouri allowed crop harvest to advance although the lack of precipitation is worsening pasture conditions. Temperatures averaged 62.0 degrees, 3.9 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.14 inches statewide, 0.53 inches below normal. There were 6.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending October 11. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 20 percent very short, 37 percent short, 38 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 8 percent very short, 31 percent short, 57 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Corn mature reached 98 percent, 1 percentage point ahead of the 5-year average. Corn harvest was 81 percent complete, 31 percentage points ahead of last year and 12 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Soybeans dropping leaves progressed to 71 percent, 9 percentage points behind last year and the 5-year average. Soybean harvest was 31 percent complete, compared to 15 percent last year and 29 percent for the 5-year average. Cotton bolls opening progressed to 91 percent, 4 percentage point ahead of the 5-year average. Cotton harvest was 20 complete, 16 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Rice harvest was 85 percent complete, 6 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Sorghum harvest was 54 percent complete, 10 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Pasture condition was rated 7 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 33 percent good, and 8 percent excellent.
