Missouri Crop Progress and Condition (11/09/15)

Rain fell across the majority of the state last week averaging 0.81 inches statewide, 0.04 inches above normal. Temperatures averaged 54.3 degrees, 6.7 degrees above normal. There were 4.5 days suitable for field-work for the week ending November 8. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 28 percent short, 60 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 12 percent very short, 31 percent short, 54 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Soybean harvest was 86 percent complete, compared to 79 percent last year and 85 percent for the 5-year average. Cotton harvest was 76 percent complete, 6 percentage points ahead of last year but 5 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Sorghum harvest was 87 percent complete. Winter wheat planted reached 85 percent. Winter wheat emerged reached 65 percent, compared to 42 percent last year and 60 percent for the 5-year average.
