Missouri Crop Progress and Condition (04/11/16)

Farmers made good progress planting corn last week. Temperatures averaged 50.3 degrees, 0.5 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.28 inches statewide, 0.46 inches below normal. There were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending April 10. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 14 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 14 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Corn planting was 24 percent complete, 21 percentage points ahead of last year and 14 percentage points ahead the 5-year average. Winter wheat condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. Pasture condition was rated 7 percent poor, 55 percent fair, 37 percent good, and 1 percent excellent. Spring tillage is 48 percent complete compared to 12 percent for the 5-year average.
