Missouri Crop Progress and Condition (06/13/16)

Drier weather this week has allowed planting and haying to progress. There were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending June 12. Temperatures averaged 74.5 degrees, 3.2 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.03 inches statewide, 0.99 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 25 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 14 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Corn condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 13 percent excellent. Soybean planting progressed to 84 percent complete, compared to 39 percent last year and 70 percent for the 5-year average. Soybeans emerged progressed to 64 percent complete, 38 percentage points ahead of last year and 9 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. Cotton squaring was 16 percent complete, compared to 9 percent for the 5-year average. Sorghum planting progressed to 87 percent complete. Winter wheat condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. Pasture condition was rated 4 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 5 percent excellent.
