Missouri Crop Progress and Condition (07/18/16)

Ideal temperatures and adequate rain allowed crops to progress at a steady pace. There were 4.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending July 17. Temperatures averaged 77.9 degrees, 0.1 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.23 inches statewide, .51 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 10 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 11 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 11 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Corn silking reached 92 percent, 27 percentage points ahead of last year and 21 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Corn dough reached 11 percent, compared to 6 percentage points for the previous year and 18 percentage points for the 5-year average. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 21 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 18 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming reached 43 percent, compared to 31 percentage points for the 5-year average. Soybean setting pods progressed to 10 percent, compared to 4 percentage points for the 5-year average. Soybean condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 25 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. Sorghum headed reached 24 percent. Cotton squaring was 78 percent complete, compared to 79 percent for the 5-year average. Cotton setting bolls reached 7 percent complete. Pasture condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 49 percent good, and 6 percent excellent.
