**Missouri Crop Progress and Condition (08/08/16)**

The state experienced above normal temperatures and rainfall last week. There were 3.4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending August 7. Temperatures averaged 79.1 degrees, 3.2 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 2.16 inches statewide, 1.38 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 10 percent short, 75 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 9 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus. Corn dough reached 77 percent, compared to 63 percent for the previous year and 68 percent for the 5-year average. Corn dented reached 11 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 19 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 20 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming reached 77 percent, compared to 73 percent for the 5-year average. Soybean setting pods progressed to 42 percent, 5 percentage points ahead of 5-year average. Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 24 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 14 percent excellent. Sorghum headed reached 67 percent. Cotton setting bolls reached 42 percent, compared to 71 percent for the 5-year average. Pasture condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 34 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 8 percent excellent.
