Requirements of the Housing Facility and Animal-Related Areas

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<u>C</u> <u>N</u>	Structure and Construction : The facility is structurally sound, in good repair, and preventative of injury. It contains animals securely and keeps other animals from entering.
	Condition and Site : Housing facilities and storage areas are neat and free of clutter. The premise should reflect a positive image to the general public.
	Surfaces and Cleaning : The construction of the facility contributes to a sanitary environment. The surfaces are kept clean and sanitary, or replaced when worn or soiled.
	Utilities : The facility has wiring and plumbing that make electricity and water readily available where needed.
	Storage : Feed is stored in a manner that prevents contamination and spoilage. Cleaning chemicals are stored in a safe manner. Drugs and biologics are stored according to label directions.
	Drainage and Waste Disposal : Waste and water are readily eliminated from the animal area. A waste handling system is constructed in a manner that minimizes contamination and disease risks.
	Temperature : Housing facilities meet temperature requirements. Outdoor dogs are acclimated. Sick, infirm, young, or old dogs are kept within temperature-controlled settings. Animals should be housed according to their health and age conditions.
	Ventilation : The ventilation system minimizes odors, drafts, ammonia levels, and moisture condensation. Auxiliary ventilation is available.
	Lighting: Animals are provided with a diurnal light cycle.
	Space: Primary enclosures exceed standards for space and height requirements.
	Shelter from the Elements : Animals are provided with shelter from the elements. Provisions have been made to protect dogs from climatic temperature extremes.
	Fire Detection and Extinguishers : Indoor and sheltered housing facilities are equipped with properly maintained fire detection equipment and fire extinguishers.
	Maintenance Plan : All significant deficiencies have been recorded in a maintenance log and addressed in a timely manner. Future needs have been considered.
	Watering: Under normal conditions, animals have continuous provision of water.
	Recordkeeping: Individual records are kept for any dogs that are found ill and treated. Records are kept that accurately document all vaccinations, worming and veterinary care. All records of inventory and disposition are kept on file.
