The state is very mixed as far as conditions go for the start of this growing season. Some areas are starting to wonder if enough moisture will come to bother with planting crops, despite the fact many other areas are well above normal rainfall for the current year. The warm days have most of the wheat crop ahead of schedule this year. This is putting a smile on the faces of farmers hoping to double crop and cash in on the record high bean prices. There are no reports of weevils in any alfalfa fields yet. Some hay is moving in the state but limited amounts. Many farmers now trying to make room for new crop hay, carry over doesn't seem to be as large as we earlier thought, mostly mid to lower quality hay. Hay supply is moderate; demand is light and hay prices are steady. Weekly Crop and Weather Report

Agricultural Summary Missouri farmers are busy with tillage for spring crops, with progress ahead of normal in the southeastern counties but behind average across central and northern districts which received substantial rainfall in late March. Considerable fertilizer was spread prior to the wet weather of 2 weeks ago. The topsoil moisture supply was reported as 1 percent very short, 7 percent short, 78 percent adequate and 14 percent surplus, a sizeable improvement from a month earlier. Subsoil moisture was rated as 2 percent very short, 11 percent short, 83 percent adequate and 4 percent surplus. An average of 3.5 days were suitable for fieldwork, ranging from an average of 1.8 days in the west-central district to 5.6 days in the south-central.

Field Crops Report The corn crop is 12 percent planted, slightly ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of the 5-year average of 7 percent. Corn planting is most advanced in the southeast district with 67 percent complete, sharply ahead of a year earlier, while planting is just getting started in the northern two-thirds of the State and is generally behind last year. The winter wheat crop came through the winter well and is making good progress in most areas. Condition of wheat is rated as 1 percent very poor, 2 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 61 percent good and 10 percent excellent, slightly below the ratings of last fall before the crop went into dormancy.

Pasture & Livestock Pasture condition is reported as 6 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 51 percent good and 6 percent excellent, well above the low ratings of the past 2 years in early April. The good moisture supply has spurred growth in all areas, although many farmers are still feeding hay, particularly in the northern half of the State. Hay supplies are rated as 12 percent short, 75 percent adequate and 13 percent surplus, with the northwest district showing the main shortage at 44 percent short and 1 percent very short. Stock water supplies are rated as 2 percent very short, 6 percent short, 87 percent adequate and 5 percent surplus. Livestock condition for the State averages 1 percent poor, 12 percent fair, 76 percent good and 11 percent excellent.
